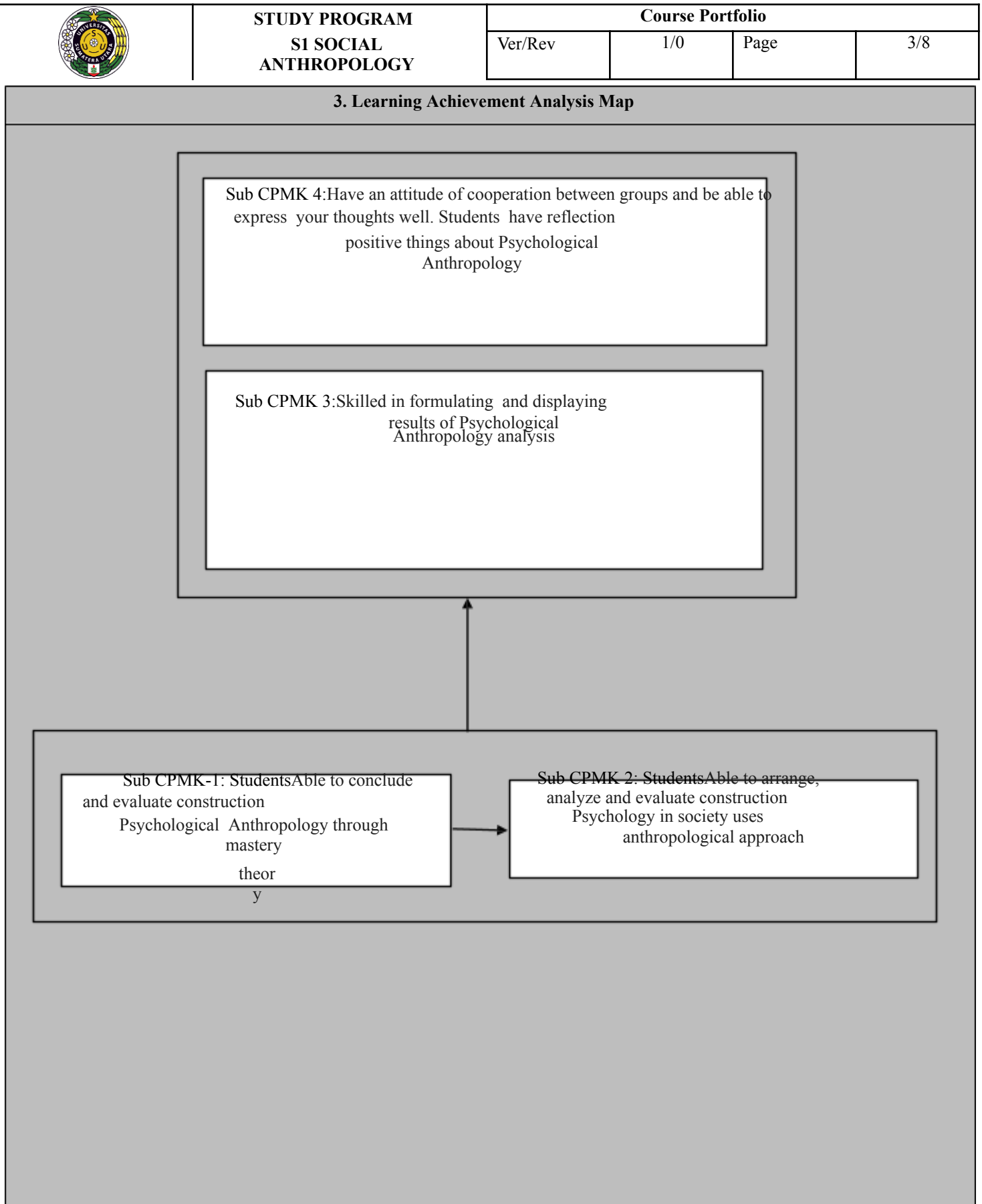
3. Learning Achievement Analysis Map
